Discussion Questions:

- 1. Did you like the book? Why or why not?
- 2. The story is told from Beth's point of view, but with entries from the journal spliced into the story. Did you like the way the story was set up? Did you find it easy or hard to follow? Why or why not?
- 3. This book doesn't have the traditional "Chapter 1, chapter 2... setup" It is broken into two parts, with each chapter counting down the days of the trip. Why do you think the author set the book up that way? What do you think about it?
- 4. What was your initial opinion of Beth, Portia, and Eddie? Did it change throughout the book?
- 5. Why do you think Grandpa made the road trip a condition of inheriting? If one of your family members put a condition like that on a windfall, would you do it? How much money would it take?
- 6. Why do you think Grandpa took the kids on the road trip when they were kids?
- 7. What tourist attraction did you find the most interesting? Are there any you would like to see?
- 8. Why do you think Beth brought the journal with her on the 2nd (inheritance) road trip?
- 9. In Chapter *14 Days Left*, Beth say that A family is "not a single unit with a single goal... Every member of the family has their own agenda." Is that true or not?
- 10. With *13 days Left*, Beth thinks "Maybe everyone feels this way about their siblings. A little competitive. A little vindictive." What do you think about that statement?
- 11. After Eddie's fight with the college kid, Beth thinks "Sometimes we are a family of assholes. You can blame that on Grandpa, he started it." What do you think about that statement in relation to the rest of the book?
- 12. If you were on a road trip with your family and you suspected someone was following and sabotaging your trip, but you had no proof, what would you do?
- 13. Grandpa believed that you can do bad things if it's for love. What do you think about that belief?

- 14. The repeating theme of the book appears to be "Why did you do that? Because I can." This line is repeated by multiple people in the book. What do you think about that life philosophy?
- 15. Nikki takes over the trip to get back at their grandpa for hitting their grandma. Was that the right thing to do? What should she have done instead? What could she do?
- 16. Who would you have sided with: Grandpa or Nikki?
- 17. What do you think about what happened to Felix?
- 18. What do you think about what happened to Calvin (the private investigator) and who did it? Were you surprised?
- 19. Did you suspect what happened to Nikki before the book told you?
- 20. Who was the real villain of the book?
- 21. How do you feel about the way the book ended? If you could change the ending, how would you have it end?
- 22. <u>He Started It</u> was written by Samantha Downing. Will you read anything else by the author?
