can safely view the Total Solar Eclipse
on April 8!

Starting March 1, you can sign up for them at **www.mentorpl.org/eclipse**. Receive up to two pairs per family!

You'll need a MPL or CLEVNET card in good standing to sign up, and you can pick up your glasses from the Front Desk at our Main Branch. Glasses must be picked up April 3.

You can also receive eclipse glasses by attending specific programs this March and April at our branches.

You'll know our special eclipse programs from the picture!

Finally, we're hosting a Science Readathon in March! Kids and teens can receive a pair of eclipse glasses when they check out two science books at our Lake Branch, Headlands Branch, or the Children's Department at our Main Branch.

Families can receive a maximum of two pairs this way for the month until supplies run out.

We know these glasses are going to be in demand. Please be considerate and only take what you need, so we can provide glasses to as many patrons as possible. (You can always share them!)
