

Stan Hywet Hall & Gardens. Each

pass is good for up to two adults and seven youth.

• Western Reserve Historical Society, including Hale Farm & Village. Each pass is good for two adults and the children in that household.

Passes can be checked out for up to seven days. They must be checked out and returned at our Main Branch.

A household may only check out one pass at a time and can only check out each pass up to two times per year.

If a pass is overdue, the late fee is \$5 per day.
